

<u>TY-specific Modules (may be studied for one year or for one term depending on subject):</u>


Computer Applications, GAA Future Leaders Programme, Yoga, Project One Sky, YSVP

WORK EXPERIENCE

At this point the vast majority of students have sourced and started work experience against a challenging backdrop of COVID-19. Work experience continues each Friday until the end of term one, with the second placement beginning in January until May 2021. Having encountered challenges in sourcing work experience for term one, students are encouraged to begin the job of sourcing a second work placement if they have not already done so. It is extremely important that all students complete their weekly work experience reflections which can be found in the Transition Year 2020-2021 OneNote Class Note Book.

Each TY student has been given induction training on using Microsoft Teams and OneNote. These programmes are important for TYs to document their learning through their e-Portfolio on a weekly basis. The sections required to complete each week are:

- ➤ Weekly Reflection
- ➤ Work Experience
- Guest Speakers

Students should complete the template in each section to document their TY journey and to prepare their e-Portfolio for assessment purposes.

Parents' Questions Answered


In early September the Parents' Association asked school management for a platform to allow TY parents ask questions relating to the TY programme in lieu of an information night which is unfortunately still not possible due to COVID-19. Below, please find the questions submitted and answers. Please note that some paraphrasing was required to preserve the anonymity of those sending in queries.

WILL TYS BE GOING ON TRIPS?

As per an update on TY trips from KCETB/DES on 22/09/20, non-essential (curricular) trips are not yet possible. Parents will be kept informed of any updates.

STRUGGLING TO FIND WORK EXPERIENCE

Please see page 3 regarding work experience. While not every student may may be in their first choice placement many students are. The alternative asynchronous learning (staying at home, remote learning) is thought to be of lesser overall experience at present.



WILL TYS STILL LEARN OTHER SKILLS (FIRST AID, DRIVING EDUCATION, COMPUTER CODING)

Yes, TYs will be studying computers, computer applications and coding on a weekly basis. First Aid, Drivers Education and a range of other activities will be included during scheduled activities each Thursday. See page 4.

WILL TYS STILL HAVE THEIR MAIN LESSON SUBJECTS EACH DAY? I WORRY THAT THEY WILL NOT BE BACK ON TRACK WHEN THEY MOVE IN TO FIFTH YEAR.

TYs will continue to study their core senior-cycle subjects each week. The Dept. of Education has made specific mention of TY being an opportunity for students to catch up on third year work and to start work on senior cycle courses. This is a significant advantage this year.

WHAT DOES THE €350 COVER?

All costs associated with Transition Year specifically: books, materials, activities, guest speakers, course costs, travel costs.

I AM CONCERNED THAT MY CHILD IS STUDYING FRENCH. THIS IS NOT A SUBJECT THAT WILL BE STUDIED AGAIN IN THE FUTURE.

French is timetabled for one class per week. The group is divided into those who intend to keep French for senior cycle and those who might not. For those who might not continue to study a foreign language into the future, their course content will be an exploratory and holistic cultural experience aimed at creating a more rounded individual mindset – a key principle of TY.
